Vice-Chancellor's report

One of the aims of Strömstad Academy is to give the members maximum time for research and other activities and to reduce the administrative burden. For this reason, we make a fairly strict distinction between administration and operation. Administration deals with finances and organization and is led by the chairman. Activities in the form of publications, seminars, conferences are led by the Vice-Chancellor. To help them, there are a number of elected representatives in the form of a board and an editorial committee. A large part of the business takes place in local chapters that are led by a local convenor The tasks are described in job descriptions and in a delegation order. These will be available on the website and are at least

initially possible to comment on. In practice, it is a description of our current work and the purpose is to show grantees that we have order in our routines. With these as help, a lot of administration can be avoided. Everyone knows what decisions they can make and there is no need for discussion or any meeting.

Marketing

This is a problem. We need to create a group, separate from the management and with creative and committed members. Before that, there must be a clear description of the Academy's purpose and direction. It is important that we describe the Academy and its activities and not include a lot of administrative considerations. In this context, the association is a support for the Academy and its activities. Specifying the Academy's purpose and focus is a decision that the annual meeting makes. The main work for preparing this proposal lies with the Chairman and the Vice-Chancellor. Hopefully, this can be determined at the annual meeting in 2023. Before then, it should be discussed in the newsletter, in the AU and in the Board. Once purpose and focus are clear, marketing can finally begin. In the meantime, we can work according to the goal-means analysis below.

Goal-means analysis

In my last newsletter, I described a vision for Strömstad Academy. I will now do a consequence analysis of it and do it in the form of a goal-means analysis. There are other ways to do consequence analyses, for example SWOT analysis, but an goal-means analysis is more constructive and forward-looking. Of course, there may be other goals and other means, and they are by no means static. Both goals and means change as the organization develops, but this is my suggestion for how we should start.

Gudmund Bergqvist: Ukraine War 9 months

Ukraine War 9 months

It is now 9 months since the Putin regime in Russia started a war of aggression against its neighbor Ukraine a war that violates all international conventions. The war has continued from the Russian side with repeated war crimes and led to the largest wave of refugees in Europe since the 2nd World War. EU started the general Refugee Directive. Despite its potential superiority, the war has gone badly for Russia with heavy losses.

Ukraine has been backed from the "West "with heavy sanctions against Russia, large financial support and large arms/military supplies. Ukraine, but above all, the Ukrainian army has shown great competence, perseverance and will to fight. Russia has constantly stepped up most recently this fall with the forced mobilization of 300,000 men, some of which have already been sent to the front without training and it is trying to systematically destroy all infrastructure in Ukraine - another war crime.

Russia has launched an energy war against the EU, leading to high electricity prices and exacerbating inflation that came after the Covid 19 pandemic. It is essential for Ukraine and Europe and the world that Russia does not win the war! This would lead to further wars of aggression to expand the Russian Empire, Moldova and Georgia are likely to be the first victims but the list could be long!

It is a struggle between democracies and authoritarian states how to dominate the world order.

Ukraine needs all the support now with money, weapons and, after the war, both financial and technical support for reconstruction aimed at a functioning society and EU membership.

So hold on! Persevere! Reduce electricity use, Help Ukraine also through civil society!

Finally, as Cato says, Praeterea censeo Kaliningradum esse demilitari (by the way, I think Kaliningrad should be demilitarized) this would eventually facilitate change to democracy and the rule of law in Russia after the fall of the current regime.

Carl Olivestam: About SA-meetings

Should our SA meetings be physical, digital or in hybrid form?

Over the years, we within the Strömstad Academy Board and in annual meetings have also thought about working methods. The pandemic came to stress our accustomed ways of working. Of course, it was convenient to avoid travel, overnight stays when the physical meetings were replaced with digital ones. After the pandemic subsided, at least in our minds, we started experimenting with hybrid meetings as well.

But it turned out that all alternatives to physical meetings had their limitations and difficulties to overcome. And so far, we have not managed to master these.

These problems are not something that concern only a non-profit association. It has become a societal problem. I was therefore delighted to come across an article where the writer more structurally gave his guidance on how we can straighten out the broken meeting culture. https://arbetsplatsenifokus.se/

There are challenges, but most of all I see opportunities, writes article author Lena Falkman.

Applied to our non-profit meeting culture, this article, which is aimed at working life, can give us a starting point for our continued work.

Working methods should be related to what we focus on: Creativity/Results/Community feeling.

When it is decided, concrete guidance is needed regarding how we can achieve a structured form of implementation that gives all participants equal opportunities for active presence and which at the same time provides continued constructive activity for our SA.

First, we take inventory of the meetings we have and which ones we should have. Then we determine a meeting plan: Every six months, month, week.

After that, we consider and decide the meeting agenda and purpose, as well as the number of participants who will be at the meeting,

The decisions then determine which technique and form should be used.

In principle, meetings can be divided as follows and adapted in the form in which the meeting is to be conducted:

- Community meeting = physical
- Creative problem-solving meeting = physical
- Difficult conversations = physical
- Work meeting = physical or digital
- Reconciliation meeting = digital
- Project meeting = hybrid
- Information meeting = hybrid

There are certainly other approaches. Now, I do not believe that this guidance needs to be followed fundamentalistically.

With this information, I just want to provide a starting point for a constructive conversation to make gatherings more cohesive/community-enhancing/enjoyable.
